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Very little coverage of neuropsychiatry and substance abuse have been included, and much of the extensive coverage of medication is dedicated to treatment guidelines. The text makes a few references to the DSM-IV and other diagnostic classification systems, and includes two case studies. This text begins with a chapter devoted to development and growth, which is one of the most important early diagnostic parameters and valuable to all physicians. The second chapter provides a thorough discussion of the signs and symptoms of mental illness, and includes a list of differential diagnoses. The more common mental disorders that are covered include schizophrenia and affective disorders, and the differential diagnoses include substance abuse and neurologic disorders. The remaining chapters offer an extensive chapter on substance abuse, including the signs and symptoms of alcohol and substance abuse, the evaluation of substance abuse, and treatment options for substance abuse, including psychotherapy, medication, and family therapy. Substance abuse is further explored in chapters on primary care, geriatrics, and the treatment of eating disorders. Throughout the text, the basic principles of psychiatric practice and principles of psychiatric evaluation are discussed in the context of the relevant disorders. The second edition of this text has been revised to incorporate changes and developments in clinical practice. The chapters on signs and symptoms have been expanded to include, for example, a section on auditory hallucinations. The chapter on substance abuse has been expanded to include information on emerging new treatment modalities. The chapter on geriatrics now includes a section on the evaluation of medication in the geriatric population. This text includes a reference section that provides numerous articles for which there are now updated versions available, as well as links to additional websites that are helpful to the physician reader. Throughout the text, the most current research and therapeutic information is provided in clear, accessible language. The author of this text has been a practicing psychiatrist for 30 years. This text is designed to be a supplement for the nonpsychiatrist and is not meant to replace a psychiatric evaluation. This text would be most useful for a medical student, resident, or practicing physician in an ambulatory setting who is learning to evaluate patients with psychiatric illness.
